### PROPERTY UPDATE AND HELP REQUIRED

As many of you will be aware, we have been tackling a number of building issues over the last three years. This has included the damp in the vestibule and the heating boiler. The investment in these projects mean that the Quinquennial report on our building was not as bad as expected. However, the report highlighted two issues which we need to address.

Firstly, as well as the damp in the floor which has been resolved, we have rising damp in the walls in the staircase areas. We have received a quote from Abbey Damp to damp wall both staircases, reduce the external ground levels and install under stairs ventilation for £5,929.

Secondly, despite remedial works, the doors to the front vestibule need replacing. Fluctuations in temperature means the current doors are seizing up or loosen and let water in. Companies have been approached and to replace the doors and side panels with double glazed 'commercial' quality units with toughened glass. The cost of this is £9,841.20 (inc VAT).

Subject to funding being in place, the Church Council has agreed to spend **£15,570.20** to go ahead with the work, with a contingency of **£1600** making a total of **£17,170.20**.

We would like to be able to contract this work but need to secure the funds to do so. You have all been very generous in your support of the previous projects and, as well as this work, we still have to run the church on a day-to-day basis. It is our intention to cover most if not all the costs of this work through fundraising and grants, and we are therefore going to look for grant funding and start a fundraising programme to pay for this.

However, we are conscious that quotes only remain valid for 30 days, prices are rising for materials, and reputable companies are in short supply to carry out the work and are booked up months in advance.

If you are able to make a donation towards the work, this would be very welcome, but at this stage what we are asking members to consider is whether you are able to make an interest free loan to the church over a five-year period or, indeed, whether you feel able to underwrite the whole amount.

If we were able to raise £15,000 in this way, we would be able to go ahead with the work straight away and would then need to raise £3,000 per year through fundraising and grants to pay back the loans.

#### A letter from the pew to all church members and adherents

Dear all,

You will have all seen, or soon will do, Derek's article about the amount of money we need to spend to carry out essential work on the church, and ways of raising it. It was agreed at Church Council that we should go ahead with the work

I was among all those in favour. I am not here to rehash the issues. I just wanted to share my reason for voting as I did.

If this had arisen a year ago I might not have done so. I think I would have thought 'Why should we spend this money on a church building, which is not well placed in the town, has virtually no parking; has a congregation of about 30 people once a week and hardly any young people, so why throw good money after bad?'

Now I feel differently. Why?

We have a new Minister

New people have been attending our Sunday morning services, Messy Church has been restarted, as a Partnership of Churches activity, bringing as many people into our building in the afternoon as in the morning.

Warm Spaces brought a different group of people in who have experienced a welcome and an offer of friendship. They come regularly.

Activities that might have died with lock down have re-emerged: Church meals after the service, a hugely successful Christmas Coffee morning, our presence in town events such as the Switching on of the lights, the Duck Race.

All this has, I believe, been a great coming together of everyone in a new atmosphere of enthusiasm and confidence and the involvement and support of everyone, carried forward by a team of people whom I can only describe as Spirit led. They know who they are.

So I cast my vote. A lot has happened in the last year and if you need further reassurance have another read of Acts chapter 2 and we shall all continue to go forward in the Spirit together.
