# Ministers Musings - Walk in your own shoes as you travel through life...do not try to fill anyone else's.

This last month I have been thinking about beginnings and endings. The garden fades into a resting phase, feeding, renewing, and replacing nutrients in the soil, cutting back a variety of things. The seasons changing, the warmth behind us, the darkness and cold ahead. A time to pause and think about change. Change will undoubtedly affect us all. But you know, I have found the secret to a good life, is to pay more attention to the beginnings than the endings. When we're young we think everything lasts for ever – life stretches before us in a huge horizon. Some of us view it as a road to walk or a hill to climb, some of us view of it as an open plain to explore. Life is different for us all. But one thing is sure, and that is that everything in life comes to an end.

There's a lovely passage in the Bible (Ecclesiastes 3) about times and seasons: you'll have heard it before. Part of it says....

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to tear and a time to sow."

I remember from my childhood how my fathers garden changed from a haven of rich green plants, fruit and vegetables, a vast swathe of beautiful, scented roses, into a patch of earth that housed the biggest bonfire in the street. Many came to our back garden bringing all manner of food to share, Lancashire hotpot, baked potatoes, toffee apples and treacle toffee, dunking apples, ginger wine, roasted chestnuts, fireworks, and sparklers.

Preparations had been ongoing for weeks, the gathering of wood, the making of the guy, it was true sense of community. These days such a communal gathering has been lost in our modern society, yet for us it was a time of wonder and awe, fun and laughter especially for the kids of the street and me. And at the end of the evening just my father and myself staring into the dying embers of the fire as we damped it down was a special moment.

Yet despite knowing the march of Time and the seasons, part of our human nature is to want things to stay the way they were..... for ever!

I wonder where this year has gone to as time seems to be moving so fast at present. We will have bonfire night and Remembrance Sunday and then already we are hurtling towards Advent and onwards to Christmas.

But as each event passes and ends, we look to the future, with hope and I expect just a little excitement. Sometimes we just have to accept the fact each ending is really a new beginning. We do not forget the past, of how it has been, the sacrifices made, the problems we in family, church and community have faced together and what we have all learned in the process. To hold on to our faith that God, can be the only constant, the one who never changes.

So, as we pause and reflect on life, let us stride out together in faith and hope towards the miracle of Christ's birth at Christmas. We give thanks for the gifts we bring to one another, and for new gifts and visions. For the memories of past times, that we look upon with love.

May our present endings now give rise to vibrant new beginnings, and may those beginnings enrich all our lives for ever.

Do you like heroic tales of mystery, romance, religious faith, hard work and military service?


Or do you prefer darker stories of disease, poverty, tragedy, petty criminality and illicit sex?
