One of the things that I love about winter, is knowing that it is hiding something beautiful in its depths. Inside the icy tree bark, or underneath the frozen ground, change is waiting. Just when it looks like all is dead and cold, the chilly curtain of winter will close and colourful spring will arrive dancing, with transformation and vibrant activity.

But you know we are all so changeable. For as soon as spring arrives, we will long for the summer. For me winter with the crisp covering of snow, frost, and mist is quite wonderful. Creation seen in the shimmering cobwebs, or in the perfection of snowflakes in a carpet of untouched pristine beauty.

So it is in life, whatever we are dealing with, we must learn to find the beauty in all the seasons of our lives. The beauty found in Christ is that we do not **ever journey alone!**
