### **Ministers Musings**

1 Peter 2:10, NIV: "Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

We often need encouragement, and that is certainly true in our challenging times. We need to receive positive encouragement from our families and friends. We especially need it in our Christian life. Quite often living as a faithful witness to Jesus Christ, in a society that does not recognize or accept Him, can bring adversity and conflict into our life. The text recorded above is taken from 1 Peter 2: 2-10.

Peter speaks of God's people as, "living stones". He reveals how Christ, the Living Stone was rejected by most of humanity and that Jesus Christ is the living cornerstone; the foundational, positioning rock upon which the Church was built.

Its structure and way, indeed our structure and way are determined by Him. Peter is being really specific about what it means to live as God's *set apart* people. Christ is the foundation stone of the spiritual lives we reveal to the world around us.

Elizabeth tells a story about travelling on a fairly crowded coach to attend my graduation day at theological college. She sat on a seat with the one next to her vacant. Having taken out her book, Marcus Borg's "**Jesus**", (and if you have seen the front cover the word **Jesus** is very visible printed in bold red letters), *she spent the journey alone on a crowded train, as no one wanted to sit on the seat next to a Christian.* She was different and set apart. As followers of Christ, we also have a different outlook on the world; one based on hope and not gloom. On certainty not on insecurity. On God's power working through us and not on our own understanding or skills.

This is the key to Peter's encouragement. It is not a half-hearted claim that things will just "get better." Peter knows that suffering is a reality for Christians who witness to Christ then; as it is today.

Both Elizabeth and I, in past and present pastoral conversations, have been asked regularly, 'Why is this happening'? 'Why does God allow it to happen'? It is the question that never seems to go away and also the one we cannot ever answer satisfactorily.

Medical advancement has eradicated much of the disease that used to decimate society. We are protected from much of the suffering that occurred in the past. We have become competent in reducing pain and extending life expectancy; but with such wonderful things, comes the expectation that we should not have to suffer, at all. So, when things go wrong, we end up asking "Why?".

Perhaps we will never have a truthful answer to that question.

But I can say this with certainty, and with the hope and encouragement that Peter is talking about; God is neither distant, nor unconcerned about our suffering. God knows God's people. God knows about suffering and loss. In our own suffering and fear it can encourage us to know that God has been there before us.

Living faithfully in these times also means living with some of the questions we ask remaining unanswered. It was certainly true for the disciples. It is certainly true for us. We like them walk in hope and in faith, in light not in darkness, never alone, always loved, grounded on a cornerstone, immovable and true.

So, look at the world again but with new eyes. Hear the birdsong, feel the rain and the sun. Recognize the first shoots of spring and new life. The world is now as it has always been, beyond our control.

Be thankful, contented, and smile.....you are living stones, *set apart* and loved beyond measure.


