Is our society so advanced that everything becomes disposable? Tablets, computers, mobile phones or even faith? It is easier these days to upgrade than to repair, out with the old and in with the new!

This month sees the church celebrate Pentecost, a new beginning but one out of something very old, and sustainable. And dare I declare to a postmodern society, something irreplaceable, unique, a gift beyond price.

We sometimes need to hold on to the traditional and valued ways because they have been tested and found not to be wanting. The disciples were waiting together in Jerusalem. They were leaderless and visionless. Suddenly, "like a mighty rushing wind" the Holy Spirit arrives and changes everything. We too can feel just like the disciples. Those moments when God seems so distant from us.

But technology will come and go, pens will be broken, wonderful people will be lost to the march of time, but the hope that is found and celebrated this month all over the world, can never be lost. With such a powerful companion great things can be achieved, lives changed, just as the disciples evidenced. So, within our shared community, which is undergoing uncertain and challenging changes, we strive together for a future grounded in hope and love. Neither the world or our lives can ever be deemed disposable, they too are irreplaceable, unique and a precious gift which God has given to each of us.

As the sun shines and you begin to see the world in a different way than you have done over the last few months let us remember we are made anew once more, by the breath of that wonderful Spirit!
